TEMPORARY SUPPLY POLICY

- 1. The Session shall seek the counsel of the Committee on Ministry before securing Temporary Supply.
- 2. Persons seeking to serve as Temporary Supply must be recommended to the Session by the Committee on Ministry.
- 3. No Temporary Supply will begin service until a contract for services has been approved by the Committee on Ministry. Maximum length for a Temporary Supply contract is one year, renewable.
- 4. Prior to the approval of a Temporary Supply contract, the Committee on Ministry shall complete all required background checks.
- 5. <u>Book of Order</u> (G-2.056) "A Teaching Elder employed in a temporary pastoral relationship is ordinarily not eligible to serve as the next installed pastor, co-pastor or associate. However, after two years of service, the Session and the minister or candidate serving as Temporary Supply may seek the permission of the Committee on Ministry to:
 - A) Dispense with a full and open search
 - B) Proceed with electing a Pastor Nominating Committee for the purpose of nominating the Temporary Supply as pastor or associate pastor
- 6. The COM shall consider the pastoral relationship in order to determine whether to grant permission to extend the call and recommend to Presbytery.

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
